Message from the Chief Executive Officer

or more than 35 years, La Clínica de La Raza has been at the forefront of providing culturally competent health care for low-income residents in the East Bay. We are a strong mission-led organization, always aiming to improve the quality of life of the diverse communities we serve by providing culturally appropriate, high quality and accessible health care for all. In 2007, La Clínica provided health care to nearly 50,000 patients at 24 sites in

three counties of the East Bay. Many of the patients we serve are low-income and uninsured, a population known to suffer disproportionately from chronic diseases, particularly diabetes, asthma and obesity.

One of our many goals in 2007 was to improve the outcomes of patients with chronic disease through preventive medicine and health education. In an effort to develop a comprehensive system to prevent, detect, and reduce complications of chronic diseases, La Clínica has been involved with the Unites States Bureau of Primary Health Care's Health Disparities Collaborative for nearly a decade. The collaborative seeks to improve the health outcomes in patients with chronic disease by initiating improvement projects using the chronic care model.

For example, through our participation with the diabetes collaborative and Advancing Diabetes Self-management program, more than two-thirds of patients experienced a drop of one point in their hemoglobin A1C (a measure of long-term blood sugar control), drastically reducing the risk of further complications. These successful outcomes were possible in part, through the work of our Community Health Workers (CWH), or "Promotoras." They are active members of the community who have been trained in self-management support to bring health care awareness to our patients. They also help run our walking club, chronic disease support group, and diabetes group visits.

In addition, through the work of the asthma collaborative, La Clínica was able to improve asthma diagnosis and monitoring by introducing spirometry services at four new sites. A spirometer is a tool used to measure the amount of air that can be inhaled and exhaled which can diagnose asthma and indicate the levels of asthma control. This intervention has improved efficiency and

the effectiveness in the delivery of care for children suffering with asthma. Over the past two years we have also expanded our asthma collaborative from 2 sites to 5 new sites.

In addition to our work on diabetes and asthma, we are pioneering new programs and services in the area of pediatric obesity and pre-diabetes. We started an early intervention program for patients with pre-diabetes that focuses on preventing or delaying the development of diabetes.

Our work in pediatric obesity includes the identification and tracking of children with obesity. We have created curricula for parents and children that encourage healthy eating and active living.

Lastly, La Clinica has a number of programs focused on HIV testing and prevention. These include community outreach to prevent and diagnose HIV and case management and multidisciplinary HIV clinic days.

La Clínica has been incorporating the chronic care approach for over ten years now, with successful prevention programs in diabetes and asthma. We focus our energy on preventive medicine and education to avoid emergency room visits. Our goal is to increase the number of people being served, while improving the overall quality of care being offered. By ensuring that quality monitoring processes are in place, we will be able to expand preventive programs and services and we will create a more efficient process of delivering health care services.

La Clínica is an integral component of the existing safety net health care system in California. As we look to the future, we hope to continue making positive changes in the lives of our patients, their families, and the East Bay community at large.



ounded in 1971, La Clínica de La Raza provides community- based primary health care services, designed and delivered in a manner which appropriately addresses the cultural and linguistic needs of a diverse array of people from Latino, Asian, African and other heritages. To most effectively serve this diverse community, La Clínica employs health practitioners who speak fluent Spanish, English, Chinese, Arabic, Amharic, and Urdu, among other languages, and who either come from the countries of our patients or have an understanding of their cultures.

Since we first opened a storefront clinic in the Fruitvale District of Oakland, La Clínica has been a point of access to health care services for hundreds of thousands of underserved people. We offer comprehensive health care services including pediatrics, family medicine, women's health care, prenatal services, preventive medicine, health and nutrition education, adolescent services, mental health services, dental and vision care, school based clinics, pharmacy, laboratory and radiology services. La Clínica offers social services support including case management, advocacy and referrals. With over thirty-six years of experience serving the community, La Clínica is one of the largest networks of community-based clinics in the state of California.

HEALTH CARE PLAN STRATEGIES, 2008-09

Children and Youth:

- Strategy 1 Improve delivery of prenatal services agency wide and increase access to early care in Contra Costa and Solano Counties.
- Strategy 2 Improve dental health of pediatric patients.
- Strategy 3 Improve obesity screening and data for pediatric patients.
- Strategy 4 Ensure pediatric patients receive appropriate vaccinations.
- Strategy 5 Maintain and improve services offered to teens including family planning, psycho-social, HIV and sexually transmitted infection testing and counseling, and mental health services.

Adults:

- Strategy 6 Reduce complications related to diabetes.
- Strategy 7 Improve obesity screening.
- Strategy 8 Ensure appropriate screening for HIV and sexually transmitted diseases.
- Strategy 9 Ensure appropriate vaccination of adults.
- Strategy 10 Decrease morbidity and mortality associated with breast and colorectal cancers by facilitating early screenings.
- Strategy 11 Reduce complications related to bone fractures in geriatric patients by conducting osteoporosis screenings.




ANNUAL GIVING 2007

ince 1971, La Clínica has provided primary health care to thousands of people at 24 service

sites in Alameda, Contra Costa and Solano counties. Over the years our health care services have increased while adapting to the changing needs of our patients. New programs and services are continually added with the commitment that we provide the highest quality of health care to our patients in a linguistically and culturally appropriate way. To

help ensure that we continue providing quality health care to low income people and to engage the greater community in our mission to provide the resources needed, La Clínica launched the *Health Care Without Borders* annual fund campaign in 2004. The *Health Care Without Borders* campaign links the mission and goals of La Clínica to the community and supports and sustains accessible health care to the community's most needy.

Through the *Health Care Without Borders* annual fund campaign, La Clínica draws on the support of indi-



ment, Dental department, Family Medicine department, and Prenatal program. In addition we provided refrigerators for vaccines, exam room tables in new exam rooms and tobacco cessation materials. We also received generous support for our 10th Annual Health Fair in order to provide important health screenings and health education for people in the Oakland area. 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
