That number includes nearly 400 children up to age 5 who received field Oral Health Assessments. The three-year-old program, which serves young children and mothers-to-be, just received an additional \$368,000 in grant funding from First 5 Tulare County. The award will allow the program to continue providing field assessments and fluoride varnish treatments through 2015. To date, O'Connor, Dr. C and the Kinder Care team have served 23,569 clients throughout Tulare County.
