Federal health official visits clinic

Marilyn Gaston, M.D., the new federal DHHS BCHDA Director, recently toured the migrant health clinics of Merced Family Health Centers.

This was Dr. Gaston's first visit to a rural migrant health center system since beginning her job in Washington, D.C. six months ago. She was accompanied by Irma Honda, Region IX National Health Service Corps Chief.

Dr. Gaston began with a stop at the Childs Avenue Clinic in Merced. She visited with the clinician staff, toured the new Women's Health Center and WIC Services Center, and was briefed on the Quality Assurance system employed by the Merced Family Health Centers. Following a luncheon with Board members and staff, Dr. Gaston traveled to the town of Planada for a visit to the farmworker clinic operated by MFHC. She ended her day with a visit to two migrant labor camps.

Dr. Gaston's visit was well received by Merced Family Health Centers Board and staff according to Executive Director, Michael Sullivan. "It's nice to know that someone at her level is caring and sensitive to human service needs, and yet, offers the right kind of leadership we expect from the top," Sullivan said.
