Cass Family Medicine provides a full compliment of primary care services for all ages including family medicine, well child checks, physical exams, women's health care, behavioral health, as well as lab and pharmacy services. Specialty services are by referral.

Most insurance plans accepted, including Medicaid and Medicare. For uninsured clients, services are offered on a sliding fee scale, where people pay according to their family size and income level.

Financial Information

Cass Family Medicine is committed to serve the uninsured as well as the insured. For this reason, a sliding fee scale has been set up to make treatment affordable to those without insurance.

The sliding scale is based upon the Federal Poverty Guidelines. Fees are calculated based upon family size and monthly income.

Referral services follow a different sliding scale which is also affordable when compared with competitive prices.

Sliding Scale for Medical Services

Level A	1 - 100%	\$30
Level B	101 - 125%	\$40
Level C	126 - 150%	\$50
Level D	151 - 175%	\$60
Level E	176 - 200%	\$70
Level F	201% - Up	Full Fee
